A French possession (called Ile de France) till 1810. Became British Colony in 1814. Roman Catholicism and French language prevailed.

J. Le Brun and his two sons, J. J. Le Brun and Peter Le Brun, were missionaries to the Island, but its greatest importance in L.M.S. history arises from Governor Farquhar's great interest in the Mission to Madagascar. As its first advocate and helper he did great service. His Secretary, Telfair, was also a generous friend to Jones, and others. Jones and Bevan went to Mauritius to begin the Madagascar Mission, and throughout the period of the Mauritius correspondence its chief interest is as an explanation of Madagascar, especially during the persecution.

For efforts in the Comoro and Joanna Island, by W. Elliott, from South Africa, see 1821, etc.

Variations in spelling, e.g. "Joanna" - "Johanna" are copied from the Manuscripts.
